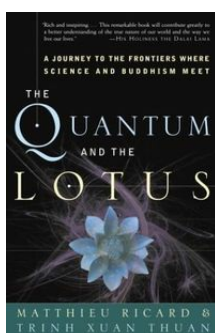


# THE QUANTUM AND THE LOTUS: A JOURNEY TO THE FRONTIERS WHERE SCIENCE AND BUDDHISM MEET
